Technical requirements:

Language of articles: English

Font: Times New Roman

Name and surname of author (font size: 10, bold), ORCID number

Affiliation (font size: 10, bold)

Title (caps)) EN (language article) (font size 12, bold)

Summary EN (font size: 10) up to 1,500 characters including purpose, materials and research methods, basic results, and conclusions.

Keywords (font size: 10) EN

Articles from 20 000 characters in EN containing purpose of research, materials and research methods, basic results, and conclusions.

Article formatting requirements

Font: Times New Roman.

Font size:

- Basic text - 12 pt.

Spacing between lines: 1.0 line.

Spacing between words: one space.

Margins: 2.5 cm.

Text fully justified

Paragraphs are related to the discussed issue hence they should not precede the fragment-sentence.

The methods of citation:

- Citations are given in parentheses and should contain the author's name and the year of publication (Smith 2003).
- In case where at the same place more publications are cited, their order in the parenthesis should be ranked by priority of publication.
- If the quoted publication has two authors, then parenthesis should contain both names and year (Smith and Kisiel 2006),
- In case cited work has more than two authors, then parenthesis should contain the name of the first author and "et al." and the year (Smith et al. 2006).
